6	I, Jennifer Fearing, declare as follows:	
7	1. I am the Deputy Director of Programs and Policy for The Humane Society of the	
8	United States ("The HSUS"). I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration.	
9	The facts set forth are true to the best of my knowledge and recollection. If called, I could and	
10	would testify to these facts in a court of law.	
11	2. The HSUS is a nonprofit animal protection organization headquartered in	
12	Washington, D.C., with millions of members and constituents, including over 1,450,000 members	
13	and constituents in California. I have lived in Sacramento since April, 2008.	
14	3. The HSUS's mission is to reduce animal suffering and create meaningful societal	
15	change by actively advocating against animal cruelty, working to enforce existing laws, promoting	
16	sensible public policies, and educating the public about animal issues. As part of its mission, The	
17	HSUS actively advocates against inhumane practices that harm farm animals, including those raised	
18	for meat, eggs, and milk.	
19	4. The HSUS has spent many years working to prevent routine cruelty to animals,	
20	including advocating against barren battery cages, urging egg producers to convert to cage free	
21	facilities, urging consumers to stop buying eggs from battery cage facilities, launching undercover	
22	investigations, and working with dozens of universities, companies, and restaurant chains to	
23	transition to the use of cage free eggs.	
24	5. In an effort to eliminate barren battery cages from California, The HSUS began	
25	drafting and refining language in early 2007 that eventually became California's Proposition 2. In	
26	addition, The HSUS committed substantial financial and human resources to coordinating and	
27	gathering more than 700,000 registered voters' signatures throughout California. During and after	
28	the signature gathering phase, the HSUS gathered endorsements from hundreds of individuals,	
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1 groups and businesses, and its employees served as primary media sources and spokespeople 2 regarding Proposition 2.

3 6. By the end of the campaign, The HSUS and the Yes on Prop 2 campaign, which I 4 directed, reported financial contributions in support of Proposition 2's passage that exceeded 5 \$10,000,000. That amount includes the costs of activities described above, as well as advertising 6 costs and other expenses.

7 7. Despite vigorous opposition from the egg industry, Proposition 2 passed with the 8 approval of almost two thirds of California voters.

9 8. HSUS was also one of the primary supporters of Assembly Bill 1437. For 10 approximately two years prior and up until the bill's passage in 2010, The HSUS's staff and 11 members actively campaigned for the bill's passage for the purpose of ensuring that all California 12 grocers, food companies, and other egg sellers would only sell humanely produced whole eggs. 13 The HSUS worked with Assemblyman Jared Huffman to advance the bill; lobbied legislators; 14 testified at bill hearings; proposed amendments; urged newspaper editorial boards to support the 15 bill; submitted official comments in support; utilized email lists to generate support; and served as 16 media sources and spokespeople regarding AB 1437, among other things.

17 9. In sum, I and other staff and members of The HSUS spent hundreds of hours in 18 furtherance of AB 1437's passage, and made AB 1437 our top legislative priority during the two 19 years it took to move through the legislature and secure Governor Schwarzenegger's signature.

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1	10. As a result of the efforts by The HSUS and other supporters, AB 1437 passed the	
2	California Assembly by 65 votes to 9, and the California Senate by 23 votes to 7. Governor	
3	Schwarzenegger signed AB 1437 on July 6, 2010.	
4
