### Introduction

This Objection to Petition for Rule Making is submitted in response to the Petition for the Adoption of Rules ("Proposed Rules") under Iowa Administrative Code, Rule 481-31.1 (137F) Inspection Standards (the "Petition") filed by Front Range Equine Rescue and the Humane Society of the United States (collectively, "Petitioners") and the subsequent request to submit comments from Steven Mandernach, Bureau Chief for Food and Consumer Safety of the Iowa Department of Inspections & Appeals ("DIA"). The Petition is substantially similar to the petitions Petitioners filed with the United States Food & Drug Administration ("FDA") on March 26, 2012 and with the United States Department of Agriculture ("USDA") on April 9, 2012 (collectively, the "Federal Petition") in which they requested the federal government "to classify all horses who were formerly companion animals, wild horses, or work and sport horses (involved in ranching and competitions, including rodeos and racing), and any other horses

without a proven lifetime medical history" as unsuitable for use in the production of equine meat for human consumption.<sup>3</sup> To our knowledge, neither the FDA nor the USDA has taken any action on the Federal Petition.<sup>4</sup> Petitioners filed this Petition with the DIA in response to the December 13, 2012, application for federal inspection services for equine processing filed by Responsible Transportation, L.L.C. ("RT"), an Iowa limited liability company located in Sigourney, Iowa. The Petition was filed with the intent, or the intended effect, to shut down RT's equine processing operations.<sup>5</sup> The Proposed Rules require every equine processed into meat for human consumption to have a valid Equine Passport, defined as "an electronic document, approved by the Iowa or United States government and issued within six months of the birth of an equine, and a corresponding microchip, installed in each equine by a veterinarian prior to the creation of the Equine Passport." Neither of the Petitioners is organized for the prevention or promotion of food safety or human health. The Proposed Rules, cloaked in terms of human health and safety, are merely a guise for the Petitioners to advance their professed agenda of the protection of all animals, and to circumvent an adverse decision of the U.S. Subreme Court delivered last year.
