(c) PROTECTION OF PERSONS SUBJECT TO SURPORNAS.

(1) A party or an attorney responsible for the issuance and service of a subpome shall take reasonable steps to avoid imposing undue burden or expense on a person subject to that subpoons. The court on behalf of which the subpoons was issued shall enforce this duty and

(2) (A) A period communited to produce and permit inspection, copying, testing, or sampling of designated electronically stored information, books, papers, documents or tangible things, or inspection of premises need not appear in person at the place of production or inspection unless communited to appear for deposition, hearing or trial.

(B) Subject to paragraph (d)(2) of this rule, a person commanded to produce and permit inspection, copying, testing, or sampling may, within 14 days after service of the subpocus or before the time specified for compliance if such time is less than 14 days after service, serve upon the party or attorney designated in the subpoets written objection in producing any or all of the designated materials or importion of the promises — or to producing electronically stored information in the form or forms requested. If objection is made, the party serving the subpoons shall not be cruffled to inspect, copy, hast, or sample the materials or inspect the premises except pursuant to an order of the court by which the supposes was issued. If objection has been made, the party acrying the subpoens may, upon notice to the person commanded to produce, move at any time for an order to compel the production, inspection, copyling, testing, or sampling. Such an order to compel shall protect any person who is not a party or an officer of a party from significant expense resulting from the inspection, copying, testing, or sampling commanded.

(3) (A) On timely motion, the court by which a subpoons was issued shall quash or modify

(i) fails to allow reasonable time for compliance;

(ii) requires a person who is not a party or an officer of a party to travel to a place more than 100 miles from the place where that person resides, is employed or regularly thinsacts business in person, except that, subject to the previsions of clauss (e)(1)(8)(iii) of this rule, such a person may in order to attend trial be commanded to travel from any such place within the anute in which the trial is hold;

(iii) requires disclosure of privileged or other protected matter and no exception or waiver applies; or

(iv) subjects a person to undue burden.

(B) If a subposes

(i) requires disclosure of a trace secret or other confidential research, development, ial information, or

(ii) requires disclosure of an unresulted expert's opinion or information not describing specific events or occurrences in dispute and resulting from the expert's study made not at the request of any party, or

(iii) requires a person who is not a party or an officer of a party to incur substantial expense to travel more than 100 miles to attend trial, the court may, to protect a person subject to or affected by the subpocus, quash or modify the subpocus or, if the party in whose behalf the subpocus is leaved shows a substantial need for the testimony or material that cannot be otherwise met without undue hardship and assures that the person to whom the subpocus is addressed will be ressonably compensated, the court may order appearance or production only upon specified conditions.

(d) DUTIES IN RESPONDING TO SUBPORMA.

(1) (A) A person responding to a subpoons to produce documents shall produce them as they are kept in the usual course of business or shall organize and label them to correspond with the categories in the demand.

(B) If a subporte does not specify the form or forms for producing electronically stored information, a person responding to a subposins must produce the information is a form or forms in which the person ordinarity maintains it or in a form or forms that are reasonably

(C) A person responding to a subpouna need not produce the same electronically stored information in more than one form.

(D) A person responding to a subpocuta need not provide discovery of electronically stored information from sources that the person identifies as not reasonably accessible because of undus burden or cost. On motion to compel discovery or to quash, the person from whom discovery is sought must show that the information sought is not ressonably accessible because of undue barden or cost. If that showing is made, the court may nonetheless order discovery from such sources if the requesting party shows good cause, considering the limitations of Rule 26(b)(2)(C). The court may specify conditions for the discovery.

(2) (A) When information subject to a subpoens is withheld on a claim that it is privileged or subject to protection as trial-preparation materials, the claim shall be made expressly and shall be supported by a description of the nature of the documents, communications, or things

not produced that is sufficient to enable the demanding party to context the claim.

(b) If information is produced in response to a subposen that is subject to a claim of privilege or of protection as trial-preparation muterial, the person making the claim may notify my party that received the information of the claim and the basis for it. After being notified, a party must promptly return, sequester, or destroy the specified information and any copies it has and may not use or disclose the information until the claim is resolved. A recall may promptly present the information to the court under seal for a determination of the claim. If the receiving party disclosed the information before being notified, it must take reasonable steps to retrieve it. The person who produced the information must preserve the information until the claim is reactived.

(e) CONTINET. Failure of any person without adequate accuse to abey a subpoens served upon that person may be decreed a contempt of the court from which the subpoens issued. An adequate cause for failure to obey exists when a subpoens purports to require a comparty to stiend or produce at a place not within the limits provided by clause (ii) of subparagraph (A)(E)(a)
