

NOTE:
Culture results on Vance indicated a positive TB status, early January 1999. As of this date, no treatment has been instituted. This animal is owned by Roman Schmitt.

There were large visible lesions on the rear legs of both Doc and Angelica. When questioned as to the cause of these lesions, it was stated by Mr. Jim Williams & Mr. Gary Jacobson that these scars were caused by rope burns, resulting from the separation process from the mothers on January 6, 1999. Angelica's lesion appeared as a pink linear scar, approx 6" long x 1" wide on the right rear leg. The left rear leg also had an scar directly below the cloth leg tie. Both lesions appeared to have been treated with an iodine-based ointment (they were moist). Angelica also had two linear healing scars on the back of the right hind leg. Doc had a pink scar on the right rear mid-leg area.
All these lesions now appear to be healing scars. After removal of the medicated ointment on 2/10, they appeared much less pink.
This issue is of concern, and will be forwarded to Headquarters for review to determine if it is a violation of the AWA (per instructions by Dr. Betty Goldentyer). A formal determination will be made at a later date and forwarded to the facility.

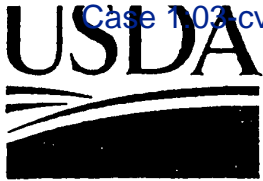

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

Each dealer or exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include the availability of appropriate facilities, personnel, equipment, and services to comply with the provisions of this subchapter.

The written/computer medical records that were reviewed for all the elephants, and Günter in particular, does not contain sufficient information to determine compliance with this regulation & subchapter, and to ensure and confirm that the elephants that undergo medical treatments receive the prescribed medical care.



Günter is currently receiving medical care for what the medical records indicate is a solar lesion. The medical records do not indicate when this condition first appeared. It also fails to also indicate any treatment plan, healing progression, or schedules for follow up examinations or reevaluations. Based on what appears in the medical record, it appears that this condition has at least existed since May 2005. From May 2005 to the present time there are only 2 medical entries, one on May 22, 2005, & one on May 29, 2005 only indicating that the lesion is "filling in".

It appears that Günter is receiving ongoing medical care at this time, but there are no written records which document what this care is. Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.

On 12/12/05, Rudy sustained several cuts/scrapes during a performance in San Juan, PR. This occurred en route from the show arena to their holding area. These cuts/scrapes appear to be healing at this time, and are not currently being medically treated at this time.

Before these elephants went into the show arena, a handler noticed a sky kennel in close proximity to where the elephants were being held backstage (near the portal). This sky kennel contained 1 poodle which was part of a contract act. The handler had requested (and observed) this enclosure removed to a location away from the elephants. The elephants then proceeded into the arena.

When the elephants left the arena to walk back to the backstage indoor holding area, a sky kennel again appeared in the same general as before. The enclosed dog began to bark which startled Angelica. Angelica then moved to the side and made contact with the backstage arena seats. She sustained several cuts & scrapes. Rudy followed Angelica and also sustained similar cuts/scrapes on the left side of the body at the shoulder & abdomen areas.


The placement of the sky kennel with a live barking dog back to the general area where the elephant handlers felt was inappropriate did not minimize stress, and physical harm to either of these elephants.

Handling shall not cause harm, stress, or trauma. Measures shall be in place to ensure that all areas where the elephants are (or will be) will not cause harm, stress, or trauma.



Note: Congo, the aged African elephant, had a very stiff gait and according to records has chronic arthritis. She has been medically managed by the attending veterinarian and handlers for this condition for some time. She also has a history of being somewhat intractable, and this has made certain standard procedures (regular foot trims) more challenging. However, we suggest that her continuous housing on concrete should also be addressed, as innovations in this regard may contribute to her comfort under these circumstances. She has a history of geophagia and impaction which preclude her being housed on grass or earth. Alternative surfaces, such as large hoofstock rubber, have not yet been tested for her and the possibility of its use should be pursued.

Note: TB trunk wash being performed on elephants on the day of this inspection. Current records taken off premises temporarily today just after procedure by the state of Florida and are therefore not available for inspection. Dr. Lindsay, the attending veterinarian and [signature] accompanied on inspection today and have verified the current testing and previous test results. *bo*

"Teetchie"- female Asian elephant with a history of thin body condition at the 12/9/98 USDA visit, and which had tested positive on 9/11/99, was euthanized on 10/28/99. The necropsy results have not been obtained as of this date.

Note: Additional shade structure has been added in several areas.
