

Procedures For Rule 34 Inspections

Plaintiffs do not contemplate performing any tests on the elephants. Below is a description of the procedures that plaintiffs' experts will perform during the inspections, the purpose for each procedure, and a list of the experts who will perform such procedures, depending on the date of each inspection.¹

A. Physical Inspections Of The Elephants

The physical inspections of the elephants will entail: (1) making visual observations of each elephant's body condition, including her weight and overall appearance; (2) determining whether any of the elephants have lacerations, wounds, or scars or whether there is evidence of any lacerations, wounds, or scars; (3) assessing the condition of the elephants' feet; and (4) making behavioral observations of the elephants including how they react to their handlers and to each other. The inspections will also include: (a) washing or wiping down any part of an elephant particularly where it appears that a scar or laceration may be covered by products such as "wonder dust;" (b) inspecting the elephants' feet; (c) inspecting behind the elephants' ears; (d) inspecting other parts of the elephants where the bullhook or other tools and instruments may be used; and (e) taking digital photographs to record the elephants' condition. The United States Department of Agriculture ("USDA") diagrams used by USDA inspectors in carrying out inspections under the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. § 2131 et seq., attached as Exhibit 1, will be used by plaintiffs' experts to record their observations, and the experts will also take notes on what they observe. As required by Judge Facciola's September 25, 2007 Order, plaintiffs' experts will rely on defendant's employees to provide assistance with these inspections. See Order ¶¶ 3, 8 (Docket No. 195).

The purpose of the physical inspections is to identify wounds and other evidence of harm, injury, or harassment as the result of (a) the bull hook and other tools and instruments used on the elephants, (b) the chains that are used to restrain the elephants, (c) the elephants' confinement, or (d) any other aspect of defendant's maintenance of the elephants. The inspections will also assist plaintiffs' experts in understanding and interpreting the elephants' medical and veterinary records.

¹ In the event that plaintiffs' October 4, 2007 request for modification of the September 25, 2007 Order is granted, (Docket No. 200), plaintiffs will immediately provide defendant with additional information concerning the further procedures that plaintiffs' experts will use during the inspections.

The physical inspections will be conducted by Dr. Phil Ensley accompanied by one or more of the following: Carol Buckley, Dr. Benjamin Hart, Dr. Lynette Hart, Colleen Kinzley, and/or Gail Laule.

B. <u>Inspections Of The Tools And Instruments Used On The Elephants</u>

Plaintiffs will inspect the "tools and instruments used by defendant in the care and training of the elephants." Order ¶ 9 (Docket No. 195). These inspections will entail handling the actual tools and instruments, assessing their characteristics and condition, and determining whether the tools and instruments to which plaintiffs are given access appear to have been in actual use or whether they appear to have been provided solely for discovery purposes.

The purpose of inspecting the tools and instruments used by defendant is to aid plaintiffs' experts in assessing the impacts these tools and instruments have on the elephants. For example, inspecting and handling defendant's bullhooks will aid plaintiffs' experts in determining the amount of force that is needed to cause an elephant to bleed. See e.g., Memorandum from Deborah Fahrenbruck to Mike Stewart, FEI 15025-27 (Ex. C to Pls. Opp'n. to Def.'s Mot. for Summ. J.) (Docket No. 96) (discussing an elephant, after being hooked with a bull hook, dripping "small pools" of blood from the arena "all the way inside the barn").²

Bullhooks: Among the tools and instruments used by defendant's employees who handle or work around the elephants are bullhooks, ankuses, or "guides" as defendant refers to them (hereafter collectively referred to as "bullhooks"). Plaintiffs will inspect all performance and non-performance bullhooks used by defendant's employees. The bullhooks provided by defendant for these inspections should be all those actually utilized by the elephant handlers. At the Blue Unit, this includes, but is not limited to, the bullhooks used by the following Ringling Brothers employees (to the extent they are traveling with the Blue Unit at the time of the inspection): Robert Ridley, Mike Hayward, Heshan, Jeff Leis, Papa, Phillip, Loco, David Polk, Isham, Adam Jones, Ahmen, and Mike Bramboro. At the Red Unit, this includes, but is not limited to, the bullhooks used by the following Ringling Brothers employees (to the extent they are traveling with the Red Unit at the time of the inspection): Jimmy Strickland, Peshta, Alex Vargas, Joseph Frisco Jr., Ryan Henny, Jenny Frisco, Mark, Pervsky, Yuri, Shoshak, Rai, Howard, Jose, Karen,

² In the event that plaintiffs' motion for reconsideration of the Court's summary judgment ruling, (Docket No. 185), is granted in whole or in part, then plaintiffs will also request, during the inspection of the CEC, that defendant make available for inspection the ropes, chains, and other tools and instruments defendant uses to separate its baby elephants from their mothers, as well as all tools and instruments that are used to train baby to juvenile elephants for use in the circus.

and George Burns. At the Center for Elephant Conservation ("CEC"), this includes, but is not limited to, the bullhooks used by the following Ringling Brothers employees (to the extent they are working at the CEC at the time of the inspection): Gary Jacobson, Kathy Jacobson, Pat Harned, Janice Aria, and Dave Whaley. At Williston, this includes, but is not limited to, the bullhooks used by the following Ringling Brothers employees (to the extent they are working at Williston at the time of the inspection): Troy Metzler and Geoffrey Pettigrew.

Electric Prods: At least some of defendant's employees who work with the elephants also utilize electric prods or "hot shots." See e.g., Electronic Mail Message from Deborah Fahrenbruck to Mike Stewart, FEI 15024 (Ex. OO to Pls. Opp'n to Def.'s Mot. for Summ. J.) ("Troy [Metzler] carried an electric prod in his back pocket throughout most of the California tour during walk-ins"). Accordingly, plaintiffs will inspect all electric prods, hot shots, and similar electric tools that have been or are currently used in connection with the handling of elephants, including, but not limited to, the electric prod(s) used by Mr. Metzler.

Whips: Whips are also used by defendant's employees in connection with their handling of the elephants. See e.g., VHS Feld Entertainment, RBBBC, Red 135th, WQ Rehearsals Animals, Rings, Tape 2 of 6; 12/21/2004 RB135-022-02. Accordingly, plaintiffs will inspect all whips that have been or are currently used by defendant's employees who work with the elephants, including, but not limited to, the whip(s) used by Mr. Frisco.

Chains: Plaintiffs also will inspect the chains that are used to restrain or "tether" the elephants. The chains provided for inspection should be those that are routinely used by defendant to restrain the elephants.

Picket Line: The elephants on the road are frequently chained on a "picket line" - <u>i.e.</u>, the elephants are lined up with their front and diagonal rear legs chained to parallel chains or cables that are secured by pickets. Accordingly, plaintiffs will inspect the picket lines that are used on both the Red and Blue Units.





Colleen Kinzley has worked with elephants in the zoo environment for over 20 years. She has been the General Curator and Elephant Manager at the Oakland Zoo since 1990. During that time she implemented the first Protected Contact Training and Management program in the country for 1.3 African elephants. She hand-raised 1.0 African elephant calf for eleven months, milked 0.1 African elephant to supplement the diet of the hand raised calf and for the purpose of ongoing analysis of milk. Ms. Kinzley developed zoo-wide enrichment programs and developed zoo-wide operant conditioning training programs for animal husbandry and medical care. She acted as an onsite consultant for the San Francisco Zoo to develop a Protected Contact and Training Management program for their 0.2 African elephants and 0.2 Asian elephants.

Under Ms. Kinzley's direction, the Oakland Zoo has participated in a wide variety of research projects. These projects include: seismic communication in elephants, ongoing behavioral study of the Zoo's elephants, evaluation of temporal gland secretions, monitoring of testosterone in the bull during musth and non-musth periods, testing of ibuprofen and phenylbutazone medications for elephants and evaluation of elephant milk for the development of milk replacer for calves that must be hand raised.

An active supporter of conservation programs, Ms Kinzley and the Oakland Zoo have raised and donated over \$100,000 to the Amboseli Elephant Research Project and the Samburu Elephant Research Project in Kenya Africa, and the Elephant Sanctuary in Tennessee.
