## CRVA inks deal with Feld Entertainment

The **Charlotte Regional Visitors Authority** has signed an arena contract with **Feld Entertainment Inc.** to host upcoming productions of Disney Live!, Disney On Ice and the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus.

"We are thrilled to be performing in Charlotte and look forward to working with Cricket Arena and Ovens Auditorium in hosting these spectacular productions," says Rana Kozouz, vice president of corporate communications for Feld Entertainment.

"Feld Entertainment produces the highest quality of family entertainment and we are excited to be a part of its spellbinding performances," says Michael Crum, chief operating officer of the CRVA.

Financial terms weren't disclosed.

Disney Live! will appear at the Ovens Auditorium from July 6 to 9, while Disney On Ice is scheduled for Nov. 29 through Dec. 3 at Cricket Arena.

Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey will bring its circus to Cricket Arena in February 2007.

Feld Entertainment, based in Virginia, is a producer of live entertainment.

The CRVA manages Charlotte's public-owned event facilities, attracting 2.8 million people annually for major sports events, entertainment, conventions and trade shows.

## Alamodome, Ringling Bros. producer ink contract extension

The **Alamodome** will play host to the 'Greatest Show on Earth' for five more years.

Vienna, Va.-based **Feld Entertainment Inc.** has decided to bring back Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey and Disney On Ice to the city-owned Alamodome through 2010. The Alamodome has held the contract since 2001.

Feld is one of the world's largest producers of family entertainment. The company's 2005 "Disney On Ice" presentation of Disney/Pixar's Finding Nemo was the highest grossing ice production in San Antonio's history.

Company officials say San Antonio also has become one of the country's strongest circus markets.

The city built the Alamodome in 1993 at a cost of \$186 million.

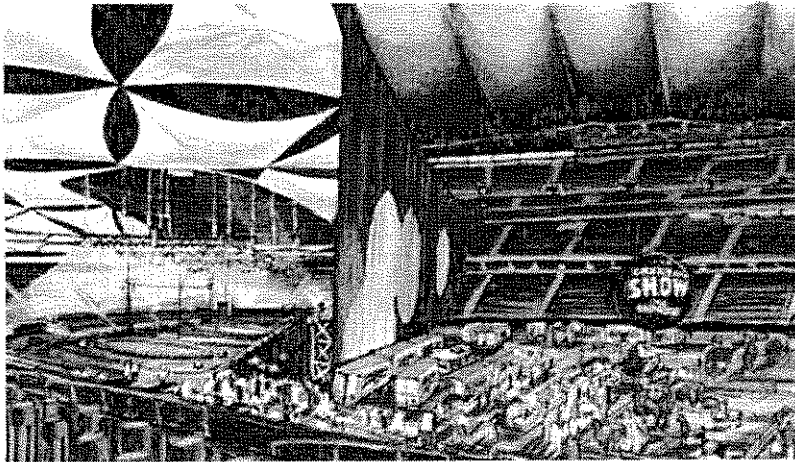

### **RELIANT PARK TO TRANSFORM STADIUM INTO THREE RING CIRCUS AND ICE FLOOR**

*Dynamic plans underway to convert home of 2004 Super Bowl  
into intimate family venue for Feld Entertainment's circus and ice spectaculars*



HOUSTON -- Feld Entertainment, Inc., the worldwide leader in producing and presenting live family entertainment experiences, will move two of its globally recognized productions - *Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey*<sup>®</sup> and *Disney On Ice*<sup>SM</sup> - to Reliant Stadium. Dynamic plans are being finalized to transform the 71,500-seat stadium into a more intimate, 12,500-seat venue perfectly designed to showcase the magic of these two extraordinary, family-oriented shows. Families visiting the Reliant Park complex for the first time will have the opportunity to experience the breathtaking new stadium via two affordable, quality family entertainment productions.

Reliant Park will accommodate both productions with a wide array of adjustments. Stadium staff will cover the translucent portion of the retractable roof with approximately 10 acres of black commando cloth. This cloth will be sectioned into 240 panels varying in size from 400 to 4,000 square feet. These panels will be attached to the roof structure of Reliant Stadium from over 5,000 attachment points. The result will be a "black out" or darkened environment necessary for the spotlights and rock-concert style lighting to illuminate the *Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey*<sup>®</sup> and *Disney On Ice* performances.

In addition, Reliant Park staff will install a false ceiling to make show patrons feel as if they are sitting in a much smaller venue. This ceiling will be made out of 75,000 square feet of light gray sail cloth that will be cut into 1,000 square foot panels with adjustable height lines. These panels will be suspended from the roof via 2,500 feet of cable. When complete, the false ceiling will be approximately 80 feet from the floor, compared to the normal 200-250 foot height of Reliant Stadium.

"We believe that with our technical transformation, convenient location and parking, Reliant Stadium will be the perfect venue to host *Disney On Ice* and *Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey*<sup>®</sup>," said Shea Guinn, president and general manager, SMG-Reliant Park. "We've just hosted the premier sporting event -- Super Bowl XXXVIII -- and now we're looking forward to hosting the premier shows in the family entertainment industry."

"The partnership with Reliant Stadium is a win-win for everyone involved," said Kenneth Feld, president and chief executive officer of Feld Entertainment, Inc. "Together, we are making dynamic family entertainment available to Houstonians in a truly world-class facility. We look forward to a long relationship together."

Feld Entertainment will also make adjustments to fit into Reliant Stadium. For *Disney On Ice* presents *Disney/Pixar's Monsters, Inc.* coming at the end of this month, a large frozen tank (approximately 140 feet x 70 feet) will convert green grass into an ice stage. Overhead, thousands of feet of cable will

lower the 48,000-pound, 400-fixture lighting grid to a standard arena rigging height, which is much lower than Reliant's rigging level. In addition, 6,000 feet of fabric will hang behind the stage to close the backstage area from audience view.

A special exclusive for Houston audiences only, *Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey*<sup>®</sup> is planning to utilize the entire stadium floor and create the ultimate circus experience as an added value. Ticketed patrons will have a free opportunity to go behind-the-scenes and see elephants, tigers and a host of other exotic animals along with exclusive historical circus artwork and exhibits via the Animal Open House. Reliant Stadium is the only venue in America that offers the environment for Feld Entertainment to hold both the circus and the Animal Open House all under one roof.

Feld Entertainment has a deep and long-running connection with the City of Houston. *Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey*<sup>®</sup> first played at Houston's Astrodome in June 1965, where it drew a record-setting 160,000 spectators. Two years later in the Roman Coliseum, Houston's own Judge Roy Hofheinz signed a deal with Israel and Irvin Feld to purchase the circus.

*Disney On Ice* presents *Disney/Pixar's Monsters, Inc.*, the first Feld Entertainment show to play in Reliant Stadium, opens Wednesday, March 31 and plays through Sunday, Apr. 4 for eight performances. Tickets are currently on sale via Ticketmaster at 713/629-3700 or by visiting any Fiesta, Foley's, FYE or Warehouse Music location.

The 133rd Edition of *The Greatest Show On Earth*<sup>®</sup> will dazzle Houston audiences from July 16-25, 2004. Tickets for this show will go on sale Friday, March 19 at 10 a.m. via Ticketmaster.
